
Library News

Winter Weather and Sledding



Is snow on the way soon? If so, we need to be prepared! Please ensure your children are <u>always</u> dressed for the cold weather as they WILL be going outside for fresh air and exercise at least 3 times a day!

When it snows, we are lucky to have such a wonderful schoolyard to slide on. Students are permitted to use the roll-up crazy carpet or the 'foam' style sleds. Any metal sleds or GT Racer style sleds are NOT allowed. All sleds must be stored outside during the school day. Students MUST write their name on their sled for easy identification. We

do NOT recommend sleds be left outside at school overnight.

Please note the following sign has been posted by the City of Kelowna with some of the same rules as CLE!

CLE Snow Rules:

- Sledding hills open at lunch and afternoon recess breaks.
- Intermediate students: Grade 4-5 students can use the Curlew Park Hills for sledding.
 - Gr. 1-3 Students: Have shared use of the small hill on our school property, beside the gym.
 - Kindergarten: Can sled on the smaller hill behind the portables.
 - For all: 2 people maximum on sleds and no linking sleds together
 - Line up at the cones at the top of the hill, and take turns.
 - Once students are at the bottom, they must move to the side quickly and walk back up.
 - Students at the top <u>must wait for the path to be clear</u> before they proceed.
 - Students who repeatedly don't follow the safety rules will not be allowed to go sledding.
 - We recommend that students wear helmets while sledding.
 - We will close the sledding hills if we've gone too long without snow and it gets too icy.
 - NO SNOWBALLS! All snow must stay on the ground.
 - Snow forts: We ask students to be respectful of the snow forts created by others.
